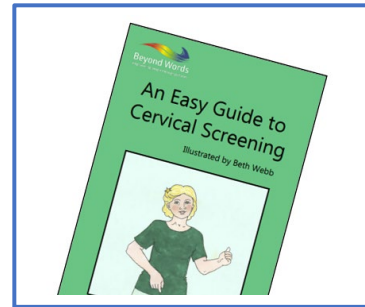


## (1) Get Involved

This guidance is for commissioners to support the quality oversight of Integrated Care Board commissioned inpatient care for autistic people, people with a learning Disability and autistic people with a learning disability.

This is a revision of the guidance published in 2021 and has been co-produced with people with lived experience including people who are currently, or have previously used mental health inpatient services, families, providers, and organisations who plan and pay for care. 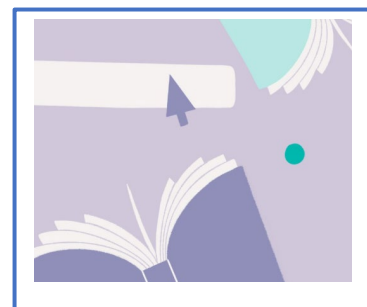

The paper is a working document and will continue to be updated.



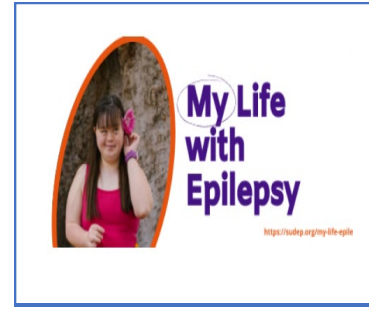
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## North Health Inequalities CoP: NEW FREE EPILPESY RESOURCES
